Youth Commission's Annual Home Heating Assistance Project

The Cumberland Youth Commission is a civic engagement program of the OCYL. This youth driven group is dedicated to giving the teens of Cumberland a voice and chance to better their community. Each year the commission has organized a Home Heating Project in order raise funds for families in need of help to heat their homes. Over the past ten years, the commission has raised over twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for heating assistance and helped over
