BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CUMBERLAND TOWN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS: The Town of Cumberland seeks to purchase playground equipment to be used at the Monastery grounds for the benefit of the residents of Cumberland; and

WHEREAS: The playground in its current state is difficult to maintain and it is challenging to secure replacement parts due to age; and

WHEREAS: The new equipment will increase ADA accessibility and the overall safety of the Monastery Playground; and

WHEREAS: Funding for this project is available through the previously approved Recreation Bond; and

WHEREAS: The Town of Cumberland solicited bids for this project and received three (3) responses. Interviews were conducted with the three bidders (M.E. O'Brien and Sons, Creative Recreation, and Swing Kingdom); and

WHEREAS: M.E. O'Brien and Sons was the lowest responsive bidder and provided the most comprehensive site plan; and

WHEREAS: Upon meeting with the Cumberland Parks and Recreation Commission, they recommended favorably to move forward with the playground replacement; and

WHEREAS: Updating the Monastery playground is consistent with the comprehensive plan which states as a goal to have state of the art recreational spaces; and

WHEREAS: It is beneficial to the Town for this highly utilized play space to have new equipment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CUMBERLAND TOWN COUNCIL OF CUMBERLAND, RHODE ISLAND AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That Mayor Jeffrey Mutter is hereby authorized to purchase playground equipment for the Monastery Playground from M.E. O'Brien and Sons in an amount not

There shall be No effect on the tax rate with the passage of this resolution.



Re: **Open Space and Recreational Bond-Use of Proceeds**

Dear Mayor Mutter:

You have asked the following questions:

Question 1. Whether remaining proceeds of bonds issued for recreational purposes pursuant to Chapters 342/404 of the Public Laws of 2008 (the "Recreation Bond Act") may be used to build a playground.

Answer 1. The Recreation Bond Act, as approved by the voters at the November 4, 2008 election authorized the issuance of bond and/or notes in an amount "not to exceed \$1,500,000 for the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation and improvement of recreational areas in the Town and the furnishing and equipping thereof". On August 28, 2013 the Town issued \$1,500,000 General Obligation Bonds under the Recreation Bond Act. You have stated that there are bond proceeds that remain unspent from this bond issuance. The project as described in the Recreation Bond Act is very broad and flexible and a playground is a recreational use. Therefore, remaining bond proceeds may be used for such purpose.

Question 2. Whether remaining proceeds of the Open Space Bonds issued pursuant to Chapters 124/149 of the Public Laws of 2006 (the "Open Space Bond Act") may be used for improvements to Diamond Hill Park – such as the pond, trail maintenance, parking lot improvements, etc.?

Answer 2. The Open Space Bond Act, as approved by the voters at the November 7, 2006 election authorized the issuance of bond and/or notes in an amount “not to exceed \$5,000,000 for the acquisition, renovation, improvement and restoration of open space in the Town”. On August 28, 2013 the Town issued \$2,000,000 General Obligation Bonds under the Open Space Bond Act. You have stated that there are bond proceeds that remain unspent from this bond issuance. You have also indicated that you will be spending bond proceeds on maintenance of an existing open space facility in the town including maintenance of the pond, trails and the parking lot that provides access to the open space and possibly a playground on this facility. While the project as described in the Open Space Bond Act is very broad and flexible, the traditional definition of “open space” will be your limiting factor. “Open space” is defined in the State Open Space Act (RIGL Section 45-36-1) as

“any space or area, the preservation or restriction of the use of which would:

- (1) Maintain or enhance the conservation of natural or scenic resources,
- (2) Protect natural streams or water supply,
- (3) Promote conservation of soils, wetlands, beaches, or tidal marshes,
- (4) Enhance the value to the public of abutting or neighboring parks, forests, wildlife preserves, nature reservations or sanctuaries, or other open areas and open spaces,
- (5) Afford or enhance public recreation opportunities,
- (6) Preserve historic sites,
- (7) Implement the recreation and open space plan adopted by the planning commission of the city or town, or
- (8) Promote orderly urban or suburban development.”

The main characteristic of open space is that it is land in its undeveloped state. Using bond proceeds on the maintenance of the pond, trails and the parking lot that provides access to the open space is within the definition and remaining bond proceeds may be used for such purpose. The use of bond proceeds for the playground is questionable. We may be able to fit the playground into the open space definition No. 7. To do so we would need to review the Town’s

Comprehensive plan or other open space plan.

Question 3. Whether remaining proceeds of the Open Space Bonds issued pursuant to the Open Space Bond Act may be used for signage at the Monastery and Mercy Woods?

Answer 3. You have indicated that the Monastery and Mercy Woods are areas of the town that comply with the definition of open space. Use of bond proceeds for signage related to open space would be a permitted use.

Question 4. Whether remaining proceeds of the Open Space Bonds issued pursuant to the Open Space Bond Act may be used for a \$20,000 grant match for Epheta Park?

Answer 4. You have indicated that you are matching grant funds from DEM for improving Epheta Park and that Epheta Park is an open space field with public benches and use for public recreational purposes. Using bond proceeds for matching grant funds to improve Epheta Park is a permitted use under the Open Space Bond Act.
