**SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION OF
STATE OF MUNICIPAL EMERGENCY**

May 29, 2020

WHEREAS: I, Jeffrey J. Mutter, issued a Declaration of State of Municipal Emergency (EO-20-01), which was ratified by the Town Council on April 6, 2020; and

WHEREAS: Thereafter, I have issued supplemental orders EO-20-01, -02, -03, and -04, which were ratified by the Town Council; and

WHEREAS: In light of the ever-changing events and circumstances, including the Governor's intentions to slowly re-open the economy in phases, I intend to combine previous orders 20-01, 20-02, 20-03, with necessary modifications based on existing events and circumstances; and

WHEREAS: Rhode Island General Laws §§ 30-15-12(b) and 30-15-9(e)(13) permit the Mayor to "do all other things necessary to effectively cope with disasters in the Town not inconsistent with other provisions of law."

NOW THEREFORE, I, JEFFREY J. MUTTER, pursuant to the powers vested in the Mayor by the Rhode Island General Laws and the Cumberland Town Charter, do hereby order and direct the following:

1. The Town will not issue any indoor entertainment licenses and I hereby revoke any current indoor entertainment licenses in order to continue to promote social distancing. Temporary outdoor entertainment is permitted under the following circumstances:
 - (a) Businesses with current entertainment licenses may operate outdoor entertainment as permitted in this section; and
 - (b) Entertainment shall include no more than two performers at one time; and
 - (c) Performers must remain at least 15 feet away from patrons; and
 - (d) All state guidelines must otherwise be followed.
2. Food truck events are permitted ~~exempted from this paragraph; no live entertainment is permitted.~~
3. Town parks and open spaces will continue to be monitored by Cumberland Police to ensure compliance with limiting social gatherings in conformance with the Governor's then-current executive order.
4. Town Hall is operating at reduced staff level. Persons needing assistance are encouraged to make an appointment with appropriate department. Town Hall will be open with limited hours as posted and the number of individuals accessing Town Hall will be limited. Persons entering will be required to complete a questionnaire regarding health, and masks are required to enter the building.



5. Patrons of outdoor parks and recreational areas are encouraged to wear cloth face coverings.

This Declaration is effective immediately and shall remain in full force and effect unless renewed, modified or terminated by subsequent Declaration.
